For those of you who have been diligently saving and recycling the soft plastics I am sure, like me, it has come as a great disappointment that the REDcycle system has failed and had to be suspended for the time being. You can go to their website to understand why but basically it is because we have been doing such a good job at recycling the soft plastics that the system has been overwhelmed.

The ACCC are involved and say that "Major supermarket retailers will form part of a Soft Plastic Taskforce to explore solutions to address the immediate effects of REDcycle suspending its return-to-store soft plastics recovery program. They will investigate solutions for the storage, transport, processing, recycling and management of soft plastics to minimize the volume that may end up in landfill." This Taskforce will be Chaired by The Department of Climate Change, Energy, the Environment and Water.

As of 28 November, public consultation process begins and 19 December is the last day for submissions from interested parties. The final determination is expected in April 2023.

For now, I suggest continuing to collect your soft plastics as before but place in the GENERAL WASTE (RED) BIN then hopefully when collections resume after April we are still in the habit of recycling it. PLEASE DO NOT PUT SOFT PLASTICS IN THE RECYCLING (YELLOW) BIN.

I intend to push for the soft plastics from businesses to be included in this Taskforce if possible or certainly for their needs to be considered.

Halve Waste Cloth Nappy Rebate Reusable & Menstrual Product Rebate 2023

As part of Halve Waste's campaign to reduce waste in landfill Halve Waste is once again running a Cloth Nappy and Reusable menstrual product Rebate for 2023.

Residents living in the Halve Waste council areas (including the Alpine Shire) are eligible for this rebate (unless successfully received in previous years).

Cloth nappies purchased between July 1st 2022 to June 30th 2023 will be eligible for a rebate of half the purchase cost up to \$100 dollars (Spend \$200 receive \$100 rebate).

Applications will be accepted from January 1st 2023. To apply and see the full terms and conditions visit here.

Reusable menstrual products purchased after July 1st 2022 are eligible for a rebate of half the purchase cost up to \$100 dollars (spend \$100 receive \$50 rebate). Applications will be accepted from January 1st 2023 until funds are exhausted.

Within our community, we some wonderful, hardworking and dedicated orgainsations that are doing great things to help reduce their environmental impact and help fight climate change. Bright Laundry has not only been trying to do its part by 36 kilowatts of solar panels (increasing its solar capacity by 300 per cent) but "are also working with clients to reduce the use of plastics where possible". They have been thinking of innovative ways to prevent their stained and ripped bedding going into landfill by giving it to several charities to 'recycle' the material. These include the making of handkerchiefs to be put into backpacks for school children which are filled by the Bright Uniting Church and given to Pacific Island school children, a charity in Melbourne making bags which are filled with essentials for refugees and the local compound and RSPCA in Melbourne to be used for bedding for animals. SUO congratulate them for what they have done.
